And, Chitwan National Park have been able to celebrate 1000 days of zero rhino poaching. However, unlike the conservation efforts in mega vertebrate/s, small mammals such as otters have been less focused. The research studies on otter of Nepal are negligible comparing to the extent of research studies in mega vertebrates. Thus, the status of otters is unclear and distribution of otters is known to be sporadic but trade of otter skins are high. Otter skins are trade with derivatives of big cats and are often bartered with shahtoosh. This implies there is marked need of research studies to understand the status and its distribution in Nepal and need to conduct conservation awareness campaign in order to save otters in their natural habitat.
